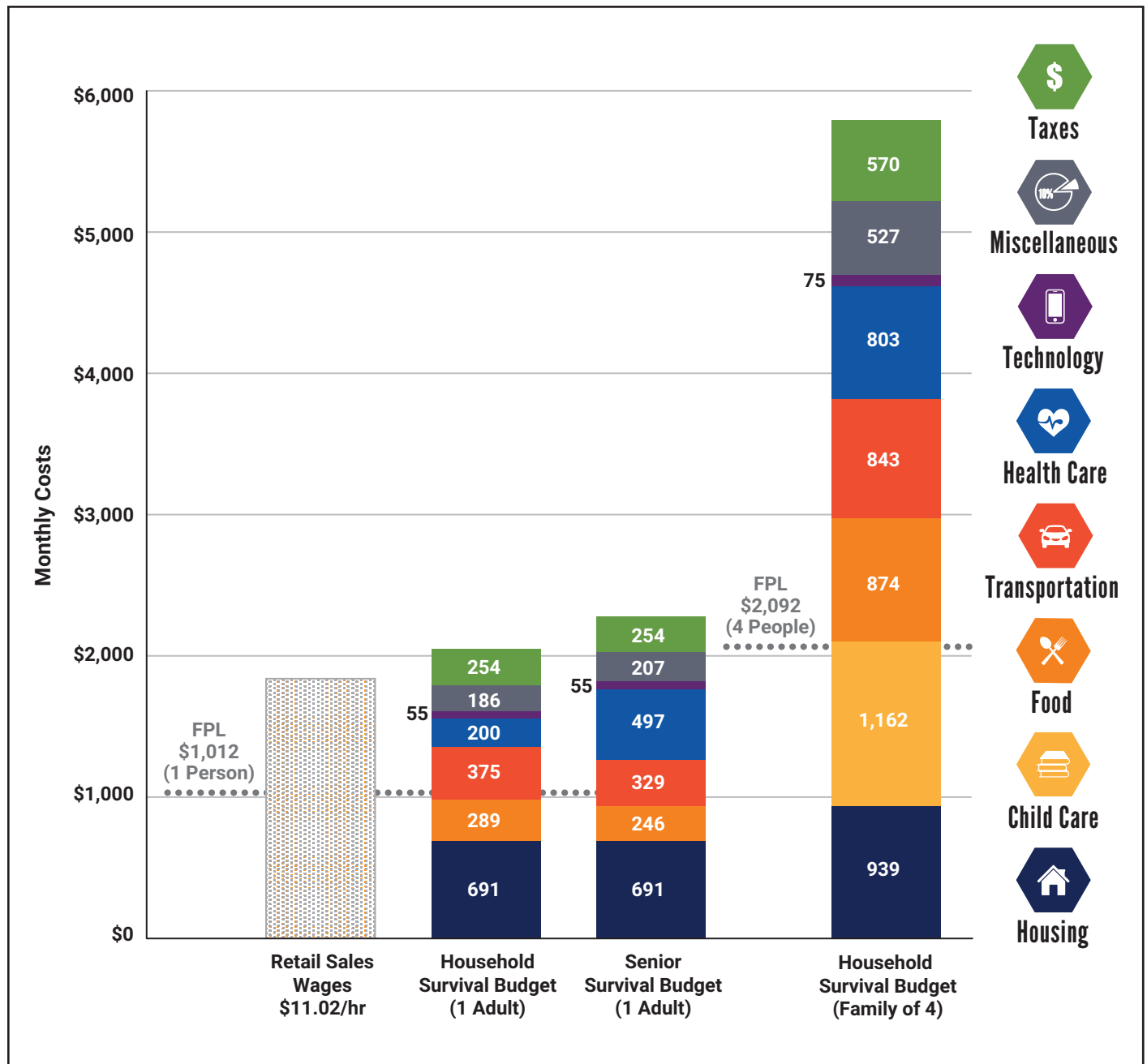


Monthly Budget Comparison, Florida, 2018
